

Learning to tie your own flies will raise your fishing experience to an entirely new level. You'll understand more about the natural world as you begin to recognize the bugs in a fish's diet and how to imitate them. You'll be able to adapt your flies to match local variations. Your fishing season won't end in the fall – it will extend through the winter as you tie flies for next year. You'll never despair if today's hot fly is out of stock at the local fly shop. Finally, the best reason: catching a fish on a fly you've tied yourself will double your pleasure. So . . . why not give it a try?

What's in it for you?

Coaching from an experienced instructor will help you quickly acquire good tying skills. Having someone looking over your shoulder guiding you in the most effective tying methods – that's something you can't get from a book or video. At the end of a series, you should have a set of flies that will catch fish at your favourite fishing spots. More important, you should have knowledge and skill that will last – something that you'll continue to enjoy for a lifetime.

The classes in each series are designed to be taken in sequence. Each class builds on the skills learned in the preceding one so you can learn progressively in a coordinated, modular program. However, if you already have good tying skills and want to learn a single pattern or technique, you don't need to make a huge time commitment – the program can be tailored. Just choose the classes that suit your fishing style.
